This is a short list of suggestions of places to eat in town while you are at the conference. This is not meant to be comprehensive. For a detailed listing of London's restaurants covering all tastes and price ranges, see the Time-Out London website: http://www.timeout.com/london. In addition to the places listed there are a number of cheap takeaway shops.

Places to get a coffee nearby

Campus has several coffee bars on it, you will find these on the Campus map: Mucci's [#29]; Ground Cafe [#33]; The Curve [#47]; Drunken Monkey [#63]; Infusion [#9]; There is also a bar: Draper's Bar and Kitchen [#8]

In addition you can find the following places to get coffee at the cross roads near Mile End Tube station (a 5-10min walk):

- The coffee room (just past The Greedy Cow on Grove Road): Run by a Roman couple who make high quality Italian-style coffee. They also have a number of pastries, breakfast croissants and sandwiches. If you are a coffee snob, this is the best place in the locality to find something to drink.
- Costa Coffee (on Mile End Road): This is a generic Starbucks-style coffee house. Costa's blend is a bit less milky than their US competitor.
- Cafe Piri (used to be Roasters) (on Mile End Road): This is a small independent coffee shop.

Places to eat: near QMUL

Near Mile End Road tube station:

The Greedy Cow (££): http://www.greedycow.com/ [2 Grove Road E3 5AX – Tel: 020 8983 3304] As the name suggests, this is a burger joint. There is a (very limited) vegetarian/vegan option, and salads are also available.

Morgan Arms (£££): http://www.morganarmsbow.com/ [43 Morgan St Bow, E3 5AA – Tel: 0208 980 6389] This is a trendy gastro pub with a number of real Ales on tap.

The Lord Tredegar (£££):[50 Lichfield Street, E3 5AL – Tel: 0871 951 1000] This is a trendy gastro pub with a number with a beer garden.

Near Stepney Green tube station:

Subway (£) [224 Mile End Rd, E1 4LJ - Tel: 020 7780 9835]

The Half Moon (£): [213-223 Mile End Road, E1 4AA - Tel: 020 7790 6810] This is a Weatherspoons pub. It provides cheap 'n' cheerful food and beer.

Near Aldgate East tube station:

A number of QMUL run cafes are indicated on the campus map. A few suggestions of places to eat and drink in the local area are included below. In addition to this, if you travel to Aldgate East on the district line you will

arrive at the curry capital of the UK: Osborne lane turns quickly into Brick Lane – a street lined by a number of establishments.

[unrelated to food, but of historical interest] If you travel a short distance back toward QMUL (East) you will also find the Whitechapel Bell Foundry, makers of the Liberty Bell now housed in Philadelphia.

Near Limehouse DLR station:

The Narrow (£££): www.gordonramsay.com/thenarrow/ [44 Narrow St, E14 8DP – Tel: 020 7592 7950]: A Gordon Ramsay run pub. Slightly more expensive than a normal Gastro-pub, but the quality of the food is reflected in the price.

Near Victoria Park:

If you want to quickly get into an area with a village feel, then walk to Grove Road and take the bus a few stops north you will find yourself in Victoria Park. There are a few nice bars and restaurants in this area.

Near Stratford tube/DLR station:

If you travel one stop out of town on the Central (red) line you will find your self in Stratford. This sports the Westfield shopping centre – a US style shopping mall with a number of restaurants, coffee shops, a food court, and a cinema. Stratford Town centre also has a number of options of places to eat.

In Royal Greenwich:

Royal Greenwich is a short DLR ride (from Bow Church, changing at Canary Wharf) away. [Alternatively you can use the a combination of tube and DLR lines] There are a number of tourist attractions, including the tea clipper the Cutty Sark, the Royal Observatory and park. Near the Cutty Sark DRL stop you will also find the Market, which is a hive of activity at weekends and has a number of food stalls at one end. You will find a number of places to eat and drink in this part of Greenwich; we include a few suggestions below:

Bianco 43 Pizzaria and Ristorante: 43 Greenwich Church Street

This is an Italian restaurant with a variety of Pizzas as well as meat and fish dishes. The espresso here is also good.

Greenwich Union and Richard I: Royal Hill

These pubs serve traditional British pub food. The Union is a Meantime brewery pub, serving local US microbrew inspired lagers, while the Richard I is a Youngs pub with a selection of real ales. Meantime beer is also available at the Old Brewery in the Royal Navy College.

Jamie's Italian:

One of the celebrity chefs' restaurant outlets.

The Old Brewery: Royal Navy College

Next to the Cutty Sark. This is a Meantime brewery pub serving local US microbrew inspired lagers.
